The South Australian Music Camp Association Inc was formed in 1962 to provide young instrumentalists with an opportunity to play in orchestras and has operated every year since then. Music Camp has for a long time become an integral part of the lives of young South Australian musicians. It is interesting to note that campers from an earlier generation often keep in touch with the movement, either as proud parents of keen young campers, or sometimes as tutors and conductors.

The value of State Music Camp is recognised by placing young players in a stimulating environment where they tackle and master challenging and enjoyable repertoire, and succeed in presenting an exciting final concert to parents and friends. What is achieved in one week is nothing short of miraculous. Campers are coached by experienced professional tutors and conductors who are chosen for their empathy with young performers. RICHARD SMITH MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

A scholarship dedicated to his memory was instituted by the State Music Camp Committee in 1995 and a further contribution to the scholarship has been made by the family of Richard Smith in the form of a voucher for the winner to purchase percussion equipment. This year James Moschou has been nominated for the award in recognition of his contribution to this year's Camp. James presented an excellent audition and has demonstrated fine leadership qualities throughout the week's activities.

CONDUCTOR PROFILES

Stuart Jones

Stuart is currently teaching brass and woodwind in five schools in the Adelaide area. He is a self-declared product of the Music Camp system being a former principal trumpet in the Bishop Orchestra at National Music Camp and the Australian Youth Orchestra. Stuart is an experienced professional musician having played with the Sydney Symphony Orchestra, Adelaide Symphony Orchestra, Australian Opera & Ballet Orchestra and four years as a member of the trumpet section in the West Australian Symphony Orchestra. Stuart is currently conductor of a number of primary school bands and the Burnside Youth Concert Band

Michel Brunsden

Mitch conducted his first State Music Camp in 1967. He has conducted all of the orchestras, tutored and held the position of Director, so he is well qualified for his role of Conductor of the Marcus String Orchestra. Mitch spent 27 years as a senior string teacher with the Education Department Music Branch and now runs a very successful private string-teaching practice. Although he tries to keep it very quiet, one of his less successful attempts at teaching involved the present administrator who even then tried to organise him at her first performance when he announced the programme incorrectly - she was eight years old at the time!

Howard Parkinson

Howard was born in Brisbane, his parent are Salvation Army Officers (ministers) so what else could he possibly play but a brass instrument!

Howard joined the Adelaide Symphony Orchestra as Principal Trombone in 1980. In 1985 he successfully auditioned for Principal Bass Trombone, a position he still holds. Howard is also the Head Of Brass at the University of Adelaide.

His teenage years were spent in Sydney where he studied both trombone and pipe organ at the Sydney Conservatorium of Music High School and the Sydney Conservatorium of Music. One of the highlights of his career was representing Australia in the World Philharmonic Orchestra in Rio de Janeiro in 1986.

Howard was a finalist in the 1979 ABC Concerto Competition.

Howard has played with the Sydney Symphony Orchestra, Adelaide Brass Quintet, Sydney Elizabethan Trust Orchestra, Sydney Philharmonia, Seymour Ensemble, Australian Chamber Orchestra and Adelaide Chamber Orchestra.

Other musical activities include teaching trombone and euphonium at the Flinders Street School of Music Adelaide TAFE for over 20 years, conducting a diverse array of professional wind and choral ensembles, solo and chamber music performances for ABC broadcasts and tutoring at National and Pan Pacific Music Camps.

Many of Howard's students are playing in professional orchestras and service bands both in Australia and overseas.

Both of Howard's children are professional musicians - Heath is a french hornist and Skye a vocalist.

Steve Eads

Steve has been a teacher (woodwind) with the DECS Instrumental Music Service (IMS) since 1974 and is also the Coordinator of Information Communications Technology.

Originally from the USA, Steve has a long history in school based ensemble performance through concert bands, jazz ensembles and orchestras. He served as musical director for the Banksia Park Concert Bands during his ten year affiliation and was the inaugural president of the South Australian Concert Bands Association. He conducted the Adelaide Symphonic Wind Ensemble based at the Flinders Street School of Music (TAFE), lectured in Woodwind Methodology at the University of Adelaide, adjudicated for Solo and Party Contests for the South Australia Police Band association, and has led his own professional big band, as well as small groups. Steve was the Convenor and Festival Director of the Adelaide Band Festival for thirteen years.

Steve has the auspicious honour of being the last conductor of the Burchnall Concert Band and now the first conductor of the Whiting Concert Band, named after the Headmaster of St Peter's College, Father Michael Whiting.

Joannes Roose

Joannes first took up the flute at the age of fourteen, and his long association with Music Camp as student, tutor, and conductor dates back to the early nineteen-sixties. He was Principal Flute in the Australian Youth orchestra for four years, and has played Flute and Piccolo in many of Australia's Symphony, Opera and Ballet orchestras. He has taught flute and a range of academic music courses at universities in Adelaide, Hobart, and Melbourne.

Joannes studied at Flinders University and the Elder Conservatorium of Music before being awarded a Churchill Fellowship to study conducting in Vienna and Italy. On his return to Australia, he was active as a freelance performer and teacher in Adelaide, where he founded the Sinfonia of Adelaide, conducted many student and community groups as well as for the Adelaide Festival Centre Trust and the South Australian Theatre Company, and taught at a number of tertiary institutions.

In 1980 he was appointed to the staff of the Tasmanian Conservatorium of Music at the University of Tasmania. As Dean of the Conservatorium for many years, he was responsible for a wide variety of academic and performance areas. He also conducted the Tasmanian Symphony Orchestra in concerts, recordings, and live-to-air ABC FM broadcasts, and devised and presented more than two hundred concerts for school children with the TSO and the Melbourne Symphony Orchestra.


He currently lives near Melbourne, where he is Musical Director of the Melbourne Sinfonia, a symphony orchestra that helps to raise funds for the Royal Children's Hospital, and is also a regular conductor of the Stonnington and Zelman Memorial Symphony Orchestras. He teaches at Monash University, and is Visiting Professor of Conducting at the Defence Force School of Music.

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
