CONDUCTOR PROFILES

Rick Plummer

Rick is the Director of Bands at Cabra College and Conducts the Junior Concert Band at Marryatville High Special Interest Music Centre. Rick is involved in many ensembles which include the Elder Conservatorium Wind Ensemble, the Australian Army Band Adelaide and various freelance ensembles around Adelaide. As well as this he is currently studying a Bachelor of Music (Performance) at Flinders Street School of Music.

His achievements include 3 times Junior cornet champion, youngest member of the inaugural Australian Brass, 1999 SABA Junior Champion of champions, Lead Trumpet in Generations in Jazz Super Band, Olympic torch bearer and Australia Day young citizen of the year 1997.

Later this year Rick will be travelling to the University of Illinois to study with Professor James Keene as a recipient of the Dr. Harry Begian Internship. This will include tuition in Wind Ensemble, conducting with Professor Keane as well as taking part in the Program at the University of Illinois. Rick is only the third person from Australia to receive this Internship. Rick was conductor of the Roberts Wind Ensemble in 2000.

Sandy Hosking

Sandy began learning Cello at the age of eight. After leaving school, she continued her studies at the Adelaide College of the Arts under the guidance of Cellist George Pederson, graduating with a B.A. in Performance and a Graduate Diploma in Education. In 1985 Sandy gained employment teaching Cello with the Education Department of SA. Sandy has enjoyed the past 16 years passing on her love of music to many young people, both through teaching Cellos, conducting String Ensembles, Cello Ensembles and various Workshops.

John Nottle

John Nottle is a graduate of the Victorian College of the Arts, where he studied conducting with John Hopkins. He has also studied with Tsung Yeh and the Swiss conductor Johannes Schaeffli.

John is frequently invited to conduct Central European orchestras and often includes Australian music in his programmes. Later this year he will be making his conducting debut with the renowned Czech Orchestra, the Bohuslav Martinu Philharmonic.

John is known for his enthusiastic encouragement of young orchestral musicians. He is conductor of the highly-respected Brighton Secondary School Symphony Orchestra and Brighton Sinfonia.

Robert Hower

Robert Hower is a graduate of the Eastman School of Music in Rochester, New York, where he was a Trombone student of Emery Remington and Donald Knaub. Having played professionally as an orchestral musician and a freelance player, he has experienced many different styles of performance; in rock, jazz, big bands, brass quintets, tuba quartets, theatre orchestras, cabaret bands, Trombone choirs, wind bands and in studios recording jingles. He has backed or played with musicians such as Sammy Davis Jr, Peter Allen, Frank Sinatra, Bette Midler, the Four Tops, the Sensations, Jackie Love, Jon English, Marcia Hines, the Sydney Symphony Orchestra, the Adelaide Symphony Orchestra and the Elizabethan Sydney Theatre Trust Orchestra. A conducting student of Nicholas Braithwaite and Frank Battisti, Robert embarked on a Masters Degree in Wind Ensemble conducting at the New England Conservatorium of Music in September 1994. In July 2000 Robert toured to Singapore, Germany and France as Chief conductor for the Australian Wind Orchestra.

Robert is also in demand as an adjudicator and/or clinician, having worked at festivals in Perth, Adelaide, Brisbane and Melbourne as well as overseas.

Martin Butler

Martin Butler was born in London and began learning the violin at the age of eight. When he was eleven, Martin received a scholarship to the Guildhall School of Music. After leaving school he studied music composition at Surrey University under Reginald Smith-Brindle and Robin Maconie, graduating with a first-class Honours and Masters Degree. Martin then worked as a keyboard player in a rock band for a couple of years. In 1981 he moved to Portugal, where he worked as a violinist in the 'Teatro Nacional de Sao Carlos' in Lisbon. During the eight years Martin lived and worked in Portugal he was able to pursue many other musical interests including arranging music for various ensembles and playing jazz violin. Together with a Polish violinist, Martin formed a strolling gypsy duo and worked throughout Portugal as well as performing on many Mediterranean cruises.

During his last year in Portugal Martin changed to the viola section of the orchestra and then at the end of 1989, he came to Adelaide with his wife Shirin Lim who is currently principal violin in the Adelaide Symphony Orchestra. In February 1990 he also joined the Adelaide Symphony Orchestra as a violist. Martin is now a naturalised Australian.

Martin has been conductor of the Burnside Symphony Orchestra (one of Adelaide's community orchestras) for the past five years. He also conducts at State Music Camp, workshops for the Australian String Teacher's Association and at St Peter's College. In the last few years Martin has conducted his own arrangements for the Adelaide Symphony Orchestra Christmas Proms Concert.







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
