# South Australian Music Camp Association Inc.

The South Australian Music Camp Association Inc. was formed in 1962 to provide young instrumentalists with an opportunity to play in orchestras and has operated every year since then. Music Camp has for a long time become an integral part of the lives of young South Australian musicians. It is interesting to note that campers from an earlier generation often keep in touch with the movement, either as proud parents of keen young campers, or sometimes as tutors and conductors.

The value of State Music Camp is recognised by placing young players in a stimulating environment where they tackle and master challenging and enjoyable repertoire, and succeed in presenting an exciting final concert to parents and friends. What is achieved in one week is nothing short of miraculous. Campers are coached by experienced professional tutors and conductors who are chosen for their empathy with young performers. The success of State Music Camp (formerly May Music Camp) is well demonstrated by the numbers of well established performers and teachers in our community who acknowledge the valuable part that Music Camp, State and National, has played in their own musical lives.

# Richard Smith Memorial Scholarship

Richard Smith was an exceptional percussionist as both teacher and performer, who served Music Camp faithfully for many years until his death at the age of eighty in 1993. A scholarship dedicated to his memory was instituted by the State Music Camp Committee in 1995 and a further contribution to the scholarship has been made by the family of Richard Smith in the form of a voucher for the winner to purchase percussion equipment.

This year Morgan Price has been nominated for the award in recognition of his contribution to this year's Camp. Morgan presented an excellent audition and has demonstrated fine leadership qualities throughout the week's activities.

### A note from the Director

This week has been a celebration – not just of the enthusiasm and talent of the young players in Music Camp's care, but of fifty years of State Music Camp itself in South Australia. In 1962, the first "May Music Camp", as it was then called, took place – a much smaller event than in 2012, but the seed from which the subsequent half-century of camps grew and flowered.

Now, with nearly three hundred students, five ensembles, and a staff of over forty conductors, tutors, and administrators, State Music Camp is an integral and revered part of South Australia's musical life.

I am proud to be part of this historic institution and the vibrant life it brings to the youth music community.

Every year, we rejoice in the abundance of energy and talent our young musicians bring to Music Camp. Revel in it tonight; and, with it, enjoy the sense of pride that the concert brings – a wonderful showcase of the energy, commitment, and hard work that has been on display this week, and which has typified Music Camps over fifty years.

Music Camp belongs to the young.

Long may they both live.

### **Conductor profiles**

#### **David Winnall**

David's musical life began with the Kensington and Norwood Brass Band on euphonium. At age eleven he won the Champion of Novice section at a state brass band competition. David started the trombone at age fifteen and two and a half years later toured Malaysia and Singapore with the Adelaide University Brass Ensemble, under the Direction of Stan Roberts. While studying at the Elder Conservatorium, he attended three National Music Camps, and was a member of the Australian Youth Orchestra for three seasons. During this period he also enjoyed working with the State Opera, the Adelaide Symphony Orchestra, and performing with Midnight Oil at Memorial Drive.

In 1987 David became a brass instrumental teacher, with the Instrumental Music Service, spending his first six years teaching in Whyalla. This gave him the opportunity to play with and support many leading jazz and rock artists.

David has performed and recorded with many ensembles in most musical styles including orchestral, chamber, swing, jazz, rock, ska and Latin. He is currently a member of the Adelaide Art Orchestra and is also a successful big band director, working with bands at both Marryatville High School and the Jazz SA superband programme.

#### **Lachlan Bramble**

Lachlan began learning the violin from his mother at age six. He went on to study with Mark Mogilevsky at the University of Melbourne and with Barbara Gilby at the Australian National University. A highlight was attending ten State Music Camps, three National Music Camps and five years with the Australian Youth Orchestra. Lachlan is currently Associate Principal 2<sup>nd</sup> Violin with the Adelaide Symphony Orchestra. He has also played with the MSO, TSO and Orchestra Victoria. In his spare time he plays with the notorious Benaud Trio. Lachlan has tutored at State Music Camps in Victoria and South Australia, at National Music Camp and for the Adelaide and Australian Youth Orchestras. In 2011 he was appointed Director of the Elder Conservatorium Chamber Orchestra.

### **Brendon Pearn**

Adelaide born and raised, Brendon Pearn started his cello studies in 1986 through the SA Department of Education and Children's Services Instrumental Music Service. He later continued on to study the cello under Janis Laurs at the Elder Conservatorium of Music, University of Adelaide.

Upon completing his music studies Brendon began working as a freelance cellist in many different ensembles around South Australia and also as a cello tutor for both the Instrumental Music Service and Independent Schools. Involved as a Manager in the first years of the Adelaide Youth Orchestra and occasionally working in the Operations Department of the Adelaide Symphony Orchestra, Brendon began to focus more on Arts Administration and consequently into Music Education.

After completing his formal Education studies Brendon has worked in numerous schools across Adelaide, most notably as the Coordinator of Instrumental Music at Westminster School, but also at Fortismere School in London. He has also worked as a tutor and conductor for organisations such as AUSTA, Suzuki Schools and SA State Music Camp.

2009 saw Brendon conduct for the Melbourne Youth Music Summer School and also take up the position of Education Coordinator of the West Australian Symphony Orchestra. Whilst working within this wide-reaching orchestral education program, Brendon took the orchestra into schools across WA. Most recently Brendon has returned to the classroom as an Academic and Instrumental Music Teacher at Methodist Ladies' College in Perth and is currently the co-ordinator of their String Program.

### **Bryan Griffiths**

Bryan Griffiths began his musical career at age nine by first learning the Organ and a year later, the Horn. After completing study in Marryatville High School's specialist interest music program, he gained entry into the Elder Conservatorium of Music where he was the recipient of a number of scholarships including the EMR Scholarship, the Victor Edgeloe Scholarship for Woodwind and Horn and the Christchurch Music Scholarship. Bryan graduated from the Elder Conservatorium in 2011 with a Bachelor of Music with first class Honours after studying with Philip Hall and Phillip Paine.

As a horn soloist, Bryan has appeared with a number of Adelaide based orchestras including the Adelaide Youth Orchestra, Unley Symphony Orchestra and the Elder Conservatorium Chamber Orchestra. His solo repertoire has ranged from Britten's *Serenade for Tenor, Horn and Strings* to Mozart's *Fourth horn concerto*. He has performed regularly with the Adelaide Symphony Orchestra, Sydney Sinfonia, Adelaide Art Orchestra, and Australian Youth Orchestra before becoming a full time member of the Adelaide Symphony Orchestra in the position of Tutti horn.

Since September 2010 Bryan was invited to be musical director of the Burnside Symphony Orchestra. He has also conducted with the Elder Conservatorium Brass Ensemble and the Adelaide University Medical Orchestra, of which he was their inaugural conductor.

### Max McBride


Max McBride is one of the most widely respected musicians active in Australia today, having found success on the concert stage and as an educator. He began his professional career early, gaining recognition as a double bassist when he became the youngest full time member of the Sydney Symphony Orchestra in 1969. In 1973 he gained the position of Co-principal of the bass section.

After two study leaves in Austria where he studied double bass with the world-renowned Ludwig Streicher and conducting with Otmar Suitner he returned to Australia in 1979 to take up the position of Principal Double Bass with the Australian Chamber Orchestra. With them he toured extensively within Australia as well as in Europe, the United States and South East Asia. He also became the regular bass player of the Australia Ensemble, performing most of the standard repertoire which includes bass as well as less familiar works such as Kurtz's "Last Contrabass in Las Vegas" with Jane Manning.

Other significant appearances were with Kathy Selby and Friends, with Pinkas Zuckerman for Melbourne Summer Music, several solo performances with Cellist David Pereira and Viola Player Irena Morozov, a concert for Sydney's Mostly Mozart Festival in 1997 with the Korean Cellist Young Chang Cho and appearances at the Townsville International Chamber Music Festival in 1993, 1994, and 1997-99.

in 1992 Max took up a full-time teaching position at the Canberra School of Music, but has kept up a busy performing schedule. He is the regular bass player of the Brandenburg Orchestra and has been invited as guest principal to play with the Tasmanian and Sydney Symphony Orchestras. In 1996, when on study leave in Vienna, he was invited to play with the Vienna State Opera Orchestra and the Vienna Philharmonic Orchestra under Daniel Barenboim. In 1998 and 2000, he was again invited to play in the Vienna State Opera in numerous performances including Parsifal, Die Frau ohne Schatten, Elektra, Barber of Seville. Max's students presently hold positions at Penn State University, in the Vienna Philharmonic Orchestra, Queensland Orchestra, Australian Opera and Ballet Orchestra, Ensemble Modern as well as other teaching institutions.

Max has also had an active conducting career, working with most of the professional orchestras in Australia, including the Australian Chamber Orchestra, Sydney Symphony Orchestra, Queensland and Adelaide Symphony Orchestras as well as the Victoria State Orchestra. Since 1994 he has also been lecturing in conducting at the Canberra School of Music. In 2001 he was promoted to Senior Lecturer in Double Bass.



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
