The South Australian Music Camp Association Inc was formed in 1962 to provide young instrumentalists with an opportunity to play in orchestras and has operated every year since then. Music Camp has for a long time become an integral part of the lives of young South Australian musicians. It is interesting to note that campers from an earlier generation often keep in touch with the movement, either as proud parents of keen young campers, or sometimes as tutors and conductors.

The value of State Music Camp is recognised by placing young players in a stimulating environment where they tackle and master challenging and enjoyable repertoire, and succeed in presenting an exciting final concert to parents and friends. What is achieved in one week is nothing short of miraculous. Campers are coached by experienced professional tutors and conductors who are chosen for their empathy with young performers. RICHARD SMITH MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Richard Smith was an exceptional percussionist as both teacher and performer, who served Music Camp faithfully for many years until his death at the age of eighty in 1993. A scholarship dedicated to his memory was instituted by the State Music Camp Committee in 1995 and a further contribution to the scholarship has been made by the family of Richard Smith in the form of a voucher for the winner to purchase percussion equipment. This year Morgan Price has been nominated for the award in recognition of his contribution to this year's Camp. Morgan presented an excellent audition and has demonstrated fine leadership qualities throughout the week's activities.

BETTY MARCUS A.M. 1927 - 1998

CONDUCTOR PROFILES

Stuart Jones

Stuart Jones, originally from Sydney, studied trumpet with Peter Walmsley and Daniel Mendelow - both members of the Sydney Symphony Orchestra. He is a self confessed product of the Music Camp system having played principal trumpet at several National Camps and Australian Youth Orchestra seasons.

Stuart has worked as a trumpeter with the Sydney, Adelaide and West Australian Symphony Orchestras and his passion is orchestral playing.

Since arriving in Adelaide in 1992, he has worked as an instrumental music teacher (brass and woodwind) in schools and from his home studio. Many of his students have had success with AMEB examinations and several are now studying at the Elder Conservatorium. In 2004, Stuart founded the Burnside Youth Concert Band. Members are of Middle to Senior High School age and the band performs regularly around Adelaide.

Stuart is in his final year of a Bachelor of Education at the University of South Australia. This year is his fifth State Music Camp, having previously conducted the Roberts Ensemble from 2002 to 2005.

Michele (Mitch) Brunsden OAM

Mitch first became involved with State Music Camp in 1966 when David Bishop asked him to 'babysit' a small group of string players who had older brothers and sisters attending what was then, May Music Camp. That was the beginning of the third orchestra.

Mitch has maintained a close association with Music Camp to this day, having tutored and conducted all three orchestras.

In 2006 Mitch was awarded an Order of Australia Medal for his services to music performance, teaching and conducting youth ensembles. The Australian String Teachers Association recognised him at the National Conference in the same year for services to Music education and String teaching.

Mitch ('Mr. B') to the students, is Coordinator of Strings at Wilderness School and has a thriving private teaching practice.

Brendon Pearn

Adelaide born and bred, Brendon Pearn started his cello studies in 1986 through the DECS Instrumental Music Service. He later continued on to study the cello under Janis Laurs at the Adelaide University Elder Conservatorium of Music.

Upon completing his music studies Brendon began working as a freelance cellist in many different ensembles around South Australia and also as a cello tutor for both the IMS and Independent Schools. Involved as a Manager in the first years of the Adelaide Youth Orchestra and occasionally working in the Operations Department of the Adelaide Symphony Orchestra Brendon began to focus more into Arts Administration and consequently into Music Education.

After completing his formal Education studies Brendon has worked in numerous schools across Adelaide, most recently as the Coordinator of Instrumental Music at Westminster School, but also at Fortismere School in London. He has also worked as a tutor and conductor for organisations such as AUSTA, Suzuki Schools and State Music Camp.

2009 has seen Brendon conduct for the Melbourne Youth Music Summer School and also accept the position of Education Coordinator of the West Australian Symphony Orchestra. Since his move to Perth Brendon has relished in his active role, and has already taken orchestral music into classrooms across much of the state, working within one of the country's widest reaching orchestral education programs.

Keith Wilson

Initially trained as a civil engineer, Keith later decided on Music Education as a career graduating in this discipline with a Masters of Music Education from the University of Melbourne in the eighties. All in all, Keith has been involved in music teaching for 40 years, 24 of which were as a Director of Music at Westbourne Grammar School in Melbourne, Lancing College in West Sussex UK and St Peter's College in Adelaide.

Keith has conducted every kind of school ensemble (including working on 40 Musicals), and in 2001 received an *Excellence Award* from the Australian Band and Orchestra Directors Association (Vic) for his outstanding conducting and contribution to the development of these ensembles in both Victoria and South Australia. He continues to do some teaching and is regularly engaged as an adjudicator at Eisteddfod and Band and Choral competitions. He has also been an AMEB woodwind examiner for over 25 years.

As a musician, Keith is a woodwind specialist (flute, clarinet and saxophones) with wide experience in the theatre, recording studios, TV studios, big bands, chamber groups, function bands and specially selected orchestras to accompany leading International artists including Sammy Davis Jnr, Liberace, Johnny Mathis, Shirley Bassey, Max Bygraves, Reg Varney and Olivia Newton-John. He also continues to compose and arrange music professionally for various ensembles.

Richard Chew

Richard Chew is an internationally recognised composer, choral conductor, singer and pianist from the UK. His works include four operas, several large-scale compositions for chorus and orchestra and music for theatre and film.

Richard has received many high profile commissions and his works have been premiered in the Vienna Festival, International Festival of Arts and Ideas, Connecticut, USA, Chor Biennale, Amsterdam, Bath International Music Festival, Three Choirs Festival, and at the New Victory Theatre on Broadway.

Richard has worked with many of the foremost opera, theatre companies and classical ensembles in the UK, including the Royal Shakespeare Company, ROH Covent Garden, English National Opera, Welsh National Opera, The London Symphony Orchestra, London Sinfonietta and Lindsay Quartet.

Richard now resides in South Australia with his wife, the mezzo-soprano and director Cheryl Pickering and two lively children, Thomas and Martha.

Richard is currently lecturer in Music and Drama at the University of South Australia and a visiting lecturer in choral music at the Elder Conservatorium. He is a regular pre-concert speaker for the Adelaide Symphony Orchestra and lecturer for the Soundings Course in Musical Enrichment, which he devised for the ASO and Elder Conservatorium.

Richard is the Musical Director of the Adelaide Harmony Choir and Chair of the Performing Arts Peer Assessment Panel for Arts SA. Recent projects include the Australian premieres of *The Shouting Fence* and *Daughter of the Sea*, which were performed in the Adelaide Fringe and Come Out Festivals in 2009.
