The South Australian Music Camp Association Inc. was formed in 1962 to provide young instrumentalists with an opportunity to play in orchestras, and has operated every year since then. Music Camp has for a long time become an integral part of the lives of young South Australian musicians. It is interesting to note that campers from an earlier generation often keep in touch with the movement, either as proud parents of keen young campers, or sometimes as tutors and conductors.

The value of State Music Camp is recognised by placing young players in a stimulating environment where they tackle and master challenging and enjoyable repertoire, and succeed in presenting an exciting final concert to parents and friends. What is achieved in one week is nothing short of miraculous. Campers are tutored by experienced professional musicians and conductors who are chosen for their empathy with young performers. The success of State Music Camp is clearly evident by the number of well-established performers and teachers in our community who acknowledge the valuable part that Music Camp, State and National, has played in their own musical lives.

Our camps have been an outstanding success musically, educationally and socially. The students put in a great effort and are rewarded with a magnificent concert to conclude Camp. Many thanks to all those who contribute so ably to this fantastic event. Our thanks to all the parents, relatives and friends who attend the final concert. Your children and all involved in SA Music Camp enjoy your support.

The South Australian Music Camp Association Inc. is a not-for-profit organisation which offers students the opportunity to strive for excellence in music by participation in one of the five ensembles during camp week. The organisational team volunteer many hours of their time and are truly dedicated to the youth music movement in South Australia.

How It All Began

A fortuitous meeting at Scotch College in Melbourne in 1943 between John Bishop, Dr Percy Jones and newly-arrived American pianist and music educator, Ruth Alexander, saw the seeds of friendship sown. Throughout the ensuing years Ruth Alexander fired the imagination of John Bishop with her descriptions of American summer music camps. John Bishop travelled extensively and brought back a burning ambition to instigate such musical camps in Australia.

The music camp movement was founded in 1947 in Melbourne but the first ever Australian Music Camp was held at Point Lonsdale, Victoria, in the summer of 1948 under the auspices of the National Fitness Council and the Victorian School Music Association. The experiment was highly successful and although the idea grew from similar activities overseas, the Australian movement developed its own individual identity.

Immediately following the first Australian Music Camp in 1948, John Bishop left Victoria to take up a new appointment at the University of Adelaide. His musical achievements in South Australia are distinguished and many, but for us, one of the most important was the establishment of the May Music Camp in 1962 (as it was called until the school year changed from three to four terms) which transformed into the South Australian Music Camp, and as they say, the rest is history...

Conductor profiles

Mark Shiell

After winning the 2005 Brian Stacey Award for emerging Conductors, Mark Shiell came to public attention when he conducted and presented ABC TV's 3-part series 'What do conductors do?' Since that time he has guest conducted the Melbourne, West Australian and Canberra Symphony Orchestras. He has also conducted MOVE workshops for Orchestra Victoria and presented and conducted numerous concerts for young audiences in Sydney as well as rurally with the Sydney Sinfonia. Mark has conducted various productions with Victorian Opera. Internationally, he has worked with Orchestra Ensemble Kanazawa and with both the Moscow Symphony Orchestra and St. Petersburg State Academic Symphony Orchestra in Russia.

Mark is a very active supporter of both youth and community music-making. Currently he is the Principal Conductor of the Percy Grainger Youth Orchestra in Victoria. Other youth based ensembles he has worked with include the orchestras of the Sydney Conservatorium, Melbourne Conservatorium, Monash Academy, State Music Camp Victoria, Melbourne Youth Music Summer School, Melbourne Youth Orchestra and James McCusker Orchestra.

From late 2009 until the present day he has held the position of Artistic Director and Principal Conductor of the Zelman Memorial Symphony Orchestra and has been the Principal Conductor of the Macquarie Philharmonia since 2010.

Michal Rosiak

Polish born flautist and composer, Michal Rosiak is an accomplished musician of exceptional versatility and has been a prize-winner of various composer competitions.

Michal held the position of Principal Flautist with the Opole Philharmonic Orchestra in Poland and was a member of the Esprit Flute Trio. In Australia, he has performed as guest flautist with the Queensland Symphony Orchestra, Adelaide Art Orchestra, Queensland Pops Orchestra and Camerata of St John's. Michal has also been a regular guest flautist and composer at the Australian Flute Festival in Canberra, Adelaide and Sydney. Since 2011 he has been a Represented Artist by the Australian Music Centre.

Michal also has extensive experience in teaching and has conducted various band and orchestra formations. During his career in Poland he was appointed as a Flute Teacher and Woodwind Coordinator at the Chopin School of Music in Opole. In Australia, Michal has taught the flute and conducted woodwind ensembles in several schools in South Australia. Presently, Michal lives in Brisbane and is Head of Bands with St Aidan's Anglican College.

Michal has previously been a conductor and a flute tutor at the South Australian Music Camp in Adelaide.

Lachlan Bramble

Lachlan commenced learning the violin from his mother. He went on to study music at the University of Melbourne under Mark Mogilevsky and continued with Barbara-Jane Gilby at the Australian National University gaining a Master's degree in Music Performance in 2005. He has also taken lessons in Europe with Lydia Mordkovitch, Howard Davis, Dora Schwarzberg, Peter Sheppard-Skaerved and has performed in masterclasses with Cho-Liang Lin and Regis Pasquier.

Lachlan has always been extensively involved in orchestral performance. He attended National Music Camps from 2000–2002 and was a member of the Australian Youth Orchestra from 2001 to 2005, performing as concertmaster in 2005. Lachlan has been a casual member of the MSO, OV and the TSO and is currently Associate Principal 2nd Violin of the ASO and has also performed as Acting Concertmaster. Lachlan has tutored violins of the AYO, AdYO, National Music Camp and at State Music Camps in Victoria and South Australia and is director of the Elder Conservatorium Chamber Orchestra. Lachlan is also violinist with the Benaud Trio.

Veronica Ryan

Veronica has enjoyed a lifelong involvement in music. She studied piano and violin from a young age and participated in music programs through Canberra and Melbourne Youth Music as well as the Australian Youth Orchestra.

She has performed across Australia and internationally with a number of Melbourne orchestras and ensembles including the Australian Classical Players and Royal Melbourne Philharmonic Orchestra.

A versatile musician, Veronica has also appeared on stage as a brass band percussionist. Within the youth music environment, Veronica moved seamlessly from student involvement to accepting roles in Victoria, New South Wales and South Australia as a tutor, ensemble manager and conductor for various age groups with youth orchestras and at music camps.

Her appointment as Artistic Administrator and Artist Liaison for the Melbourne International Festival of Brass (2007-2011) and Event Coordinator for The Music Page added an international perspective and significant leadership, administrative and technical expertise. Veronica has extensive instrumental and ensemble teaching experience, working at various schools in Melbourne before relocating to Adelaide where she is currently Coordinator of Strings at St Andrews School, Walkerville.

Leanda Herring

Leanda is Head of Music at Woodville High School's Special Interest Music Centre. She was one of the inaugural Special Interest Music students at Brighton Secondary School, where she was Music Dux in her final year. She was accepted into the Bachelor of Music at the Elder Conservatorium of Music and completed her degree majoring in solo performance on trumpet. She went on to complete her Graduate Diploma in Education, followed by a Bachelor of Education. She has taught as both an instrumental and classroom music teacher and continues to perform.

As a performance specialist, conductor and music educator, Leanda has a commitment to quality public performance, believing that it forms a crucial part of student development and should be encouraged at the highest possible level. Her experience as a young adult attending both State and National Music Camps, as a performer with both the State and National Youth Orchestras and Wind Ensembles and as a regular tutor for State Music Camp provides evidence of her commitment to the philosophy behind participating in music opportunities such as those offered at State Music Camp. Her thirty years of experience as a teacher, musical director of student ensembles in concert band, jazz ensemble and solo performance has resulted in an undeniable passion for assisting young musicians to achieve their best. Leanda is again delighted to be conducting the Hawkes Wind Ensemble in 2014 and is looking forward to working with new and returning students this year!



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
